





Electrical Conductivity (EC)













Ground truthing = Soil texture

 - 11) heavy stony




Estimate of Plant Establishment



Coldstream Mains – Conductivity Map








Coldstream Mains – Soil Texture








Coldstream Mains – Crop Establishment
